

## **The Board of Trustees of the National Dialogue Calls on Egyptians for a Rally Next Friday in front of the Unknown Soldier Memorial**

Given the serious developments which the Palestinian Cause, the core of all Arab causes, is facing up, and in a decisive rejection of the barbarian assaults committed by the occupation state against our Palestinian brothers in Gaza Strip and the West Bank, and reiterating the unity of the Egyptian people and their country in the face of the threats on liquidating the Palestinian Cause and infringing on the national security of Egypt and its territorial integrity, the Board of Trustees of the National Dialogue, which represents all segments of Egypt and its political, national popular and union powers, calls on the citizens of Egypt to observe a big popular rally on Friday 20th of October 2023 after performing the Friday Prayers in front of the Unknown Soldier Memorial on the Nasr Avenue, Nasr City, Cairo.
